
The following instructions will make a pair of slippers approximately size 3-4.

Materials needed:

8mm & 10mm Crochet Hook
2 Bobbins of Hooplaryarn of any colour (you will have yarn left over)

To Make:

ch – chain stitch, sc - single crochet, slst – slip stitch



This shows the first row of dc around the chain length.

Using the 10mm hook ch11

Row 1 - Miss 1ch. 2dc in next ch. 1dc in next 8ch. 2dc in next ch. Now work 2dc in the opposite side of the same ch to turn the corner. You will now work along the opposite side of the length of chain; 1dc in next 8ch. 2dc in last ch and slst to join the round.

Row 2 - 1ch. 2dc in next 2dc. *1dc in next 8dc**, 2dc in next 4dc. Repeat * to **. 2dc in next 2dc. Slst to join the round.

Row 3 - 1ch. 2dc in next 3dc. *1dc in next 10dc**. 2dc in next 6dc. Repeat * to **. 2dc in next 3dc. Slst to join the round.

Row 4 - 1ch, 1 dc in each dc. Slst to join.

Rows 5-7 as for row 4. Fasten off.

Upper

Crotchet 4ch.


Row 1 - miss 1ch. 1dc in next 3ch.

Row 2 - 1ch to turn. 2dc in 1 dc, 1dc, 2dc in last dc.

Row 3 - 1ch to turn. 2dc in 1dc, 1dc in next 3dc, 2dc in last dc (to give 7 stitches).

Row 4 - 1ch to turn. 1dc in each dc.

Row 5 – 8 (repeat as for row 4).
Fasten off.


This shows the shaping for the slipper upper

Constructing the slipper

Mark the centre front stitch on the main body of the slipper with a pin.
Pin the centre stitch of the 3dc of the first row of the top piece to the central stitch you have just pinned. Match the row edges and stitches to the stitches around the edge of the main body of the slipper working away from the centre pin in both directions. Pin the upper in place.

Join a contrasting colour to the side of the slipper where the upper is pinned.
Use an 8.00mm crochet hook to work around the edge of the slipper in dc, attaching the upper to the side as you go.

When you have gone all the way round the slipper do not slst to join; take the hook out of the loop and pull the loop through the first dc of the contrasting colour towards the inside of the slipper (keep the yarn on the inside too). Now, dc across the top of the upper. Take the loop off the hook and pull it through to the outside edge of the slipper. Fasten off and sew in loose threads.

Weave hoopla yarn through the stitches of the top row of the main colour starting at the centre of the upper.

Thread large wooden beads onto the ties and knot in place.

Repeat the whole procedure for the second slipper.

If you want to make larger slippers, increase the number of chain stitches you start with (add 2-3ch per shoe size) but treat the curved ends the same (the same number of increases each row as for the smaller size). You will also have to add extra rows to the upper.

The surface texture of the sole can feel unusual at first, if you find you do not get use to it, you can always fix a fleecy insole to the inside of the slipper for a little extra luxury!
